




An Amazing Team of Artists Bring Public Art to Grove Hall

A new mural celebrates Boston's Black History heroes

Dorchester, MA

The Grove Hall Post Office wall has been transformed from a blighted and long neglected into an artistic work that celebrates Black heroes. For years, Jamarhl Crawford and his artistic friends had a vision for a mural on the wall that would serve as a gateway to Grove Hall. With funding from Greater Grove Hall Main Streets, KingBoston, and community donations, Jamarhl and a team of exceptional artists of color made that vision a reality.

"When I heard he had permission to paint a mural on the wall and he had Ricardo "Deme5" Gomez, who did "Roxbury Love" committed as one of the first artists, I was all in," said Ed Gaskin Executive Director of Greater Grove Hall Main Streets. "Jamarhl and a number of volunteers worked several weekends to clear the lot in front of the mural.

"We (Greater Grove Hall main Streets) used to get so many complaints from residents about the lot and the wall. Now people coming into the Grove Hall business district will have a much better first impression."

"The artists all wanted to use their skills, their art to improve the community and they did that," said Jamarhl.

Burke HS Equity Roundtable Signature of Support

By 2027, the Boston Public Schools hopes to have up to twelve new school buildings or major transformations of buildings. The district also plans to increase the number of students making one transition during their K-12 experience by reconfiguring up to

- twenty more pre-K-6 elementary schools and
- seven more 6/7-12 secondary schools (while preserving strong K-8/9-12 options for families)

Views from Afghanistan: Then and Now

SATURDAY, DECEMBER 4, 7PM

When global tragedies happen it often seems too far removed from our daily lives. They may move us, but we seem too displaced to help in any meaningful way.

JP Movie Night - working in collaboration with CS Film - is hosting a film screening fundraiser to combat that feeling of powerlessness.

On December 4, JPMN is showing five short documentaries made by Afghani nationals prior to the Taliban takeover. Those same filmmakers are now refugees in other countries, or are in hiding within their own. All proceeds from the night will go towards an effort to bring those filmmakers to safety.

The night may be capped by a live audio conversation with those filmmakers, depending on their situation on the night of the screening.

NOTE: All attendees will be asked to show proof of vaccination at the door, and masks will be required indoors - as per state mandate.


