City Nature Challenge: Boston Area

The <u>City Nature Challenge: Boston Area</u> Steering Committee is super excited as we gear up for this year's CNC, which has become a large global effort! If you haven't connected with us this year about participating, please do so via this <u>Google form</u>. In 2021, we are again taking a place-based focus encouraging everyone to document biodiversity encouraging a stay-local focus. In 2020, while we had fewer overall observations, we increased the number of species documented by 200 species!

This year's CNC will run from April 30 - May 9, with **April 30 - May 3** being the observation phase and **May 4 - May 9, 2021** being our time to help improve identification in the CNC. We will once again be documenting biodiversity within the I-495 corridor, out to Stellwagen Bank, and include Cape Cod and islands.

For 2021, we will build on the success of a place-based focus to document biodiversity and encourage you to keep it local and safe! Go slow and steady to explore in detail the biodiversity near you. We will continue to use iNaturalist to record observations and tally results. However you participate, we want to support your efforts.

Our <u>website</u> has been updated for 2021 and is ready to list your group as a participating organization - just let us know! Ready to join as a participating organization? Please register your organization with us by completing this google form (if you haven't already) to let us know you are participating. Here are a few examples of how you can become a participating organizations in the 2021 CNC in the Boston Area:

- Spread the word! Send out information about the CNC to your member or volunteer lists.
- Plan an event or incorporate the CNC into your existing events. Encourage involvement virtually or in safe ways as outlined by your organization respecting local health guidelines. While we aren't hosting an event calendar this year feel free to tag us on social media and we'll help spread the word. (@bostoncnc on Twitter, Facebook, Instagram)
- Help make IDs during the observation (April 30- May 3) and the identification periods (May 4 May 9). The more observations we identify to species level, the bigger our tally!
- Make use of the data collected by the CNC to help your conservation, management or research efforts. Check out <u>this quick video from Dr. Corey</u> <u>Callaghan highlighting how data from the CNC: Boston Area has been used so far!</u>
- If you're an educator (formal or informal) let us help you get youth involved with our Education Toolkit! This includes NGSS-aligned pre-, during, and post-event materials.

Do you live in Grove Hall? In the neighborhoods bordered by Seaver Street, Blue Hill Avenue, or American Legion Highway?


Please join us for a meeting to consider the Action Planners' proposal for the Seaver Street and Blue Hill Avenue edge of the park:

West End House is delighted to announce an exciting opportunity for a local installation artist to lead our community in celebrating hope and healing through art this summer!

Esperanza: A Celebration of Hope and Healing through Art is a joint effort between a local artist and the West End House community of members, alumni, partners, and neighbors in Allston-Brighton. West End House is an innovative and vibrant youth development and college success organization that has been providing outcomes-driven programs to the youth of Boston for 115 years! The selected artist and community members will create a collaborative art installation inspired by the theme: Celebrating Hope and Healing. Esperanza also engages community members with artmaking through hands-on workshops culminating in the thematic exhibition conceived, designed, and led by the selected artist.

West End house seeks an artist for this opportunity who self-identifies as ALAANA+ (African, Latinx, Asian, Arab, or Native American) or BIPOC (Black, Indigenous, People of Color), as these groups are largely representative of our organization's members.

During the summer, a local artist will guide and collaborate with community members of all ages to create a final exhibition on view during September and October after its completion. The completed project is exhibited within the grounds of the West End House Boys and Girls Club at 105 Allston St. We hope you will join us in creating a visual representation of our vibrant community as a symbol of hope and strength as we emerge from the trials of the past year together and perhaps, more aptly, together apart.

Has your Business Been Affected by COVID-19?

The <u>Boston Local Development Corporation</u> (BLDC) has been awarded relief funds by the EDA CARES Act to help the City of Boston Small Businesses navigate the financial challenges brought on by COVID-19.

Loans are available for existing businesses, new ventures, and businesses relocating to the City of Boston. These loans range from \$10,000 to \$150,000. For Boston companies in the industrial and manufacturing sectors, loans can go up to \$250,000. Funds can be used for working capital, equipment, utilities, expansion, and many other business needs. BLDC loans have flexible terms and there are no prepayment penalties.

- Substitute for the lack of, or reduced, **bank financing to activate new business projects** currently in the pipeline.
- Assist with funding improvements to a small business's social media presence to activate sales.
- Provide working capital to assist businesses as they hire and/or rehire staff and to fund restocking inventory needed to activate sales.

There are a few ways you can start engaging with us:

1. Become a technical assistance or capital partner for the Massachusetts Equitable PPP Access Initiative which is helping underserved business owners apply for PPP loans and seek forgiveness of existing loans. This work will continue through this summer. Training and resources are provided to participating partners. Please reach out to Doug Ling at <u>dling@lisc.org</u> to participate.

2. Share our recent MassINC report, <u>Unleashing the Potential of Entrepreneurs of Color in</u> <u>Massachusetts</u>, which challenges us to close racial and ethnic gaps in business ownership by the end of the decade, and lays out a near-term policy blueprint for this work. <u>View the recording</u> of the release.

3. Encourage your MA legislators to co-sponsor the legislation filed by Sen. Lesser and Rep. Cabral called An Act to Promote Inclusive Entrepreneurship and Economic Justice (<u>HD 4004</u> / <u>SD 2387</u>). This bill was written to advance many of the recommendations in our MassInc report.

4. Contact your legislators and urge them to support \$10 million for the Small Business Technical Assistance program. Here is a <u>fact sheet</u> for more info: <u>https://www.macdc.org/sites/default/files/documents/sbta_fact_sheet.pdf</u>
