Mayor Janey Announces Upham's Corner Arts & Innovation District Moves Forward With Release of First RFP

Mayor Kim Janey, the Boston Planning & Development Agency and the Department of Neighborhood Development are moving forward with the first of two Requests for

Proposals (RFPs) that advance the implementation of Imagine Boston 2030 and the creation of the Upham's Corner Arts & Innovation District. Together, the RFPs advance the community's vision to build a new Upham's Corner branch of the Boston Public Library, designate an experienced operator for the Strand Theatre, create affordable housing and affordable commercial space that supports both local residents and business owners, revitalize Upham's Corner as a cultural destination, and to serve as a model for development without displacement.

Like all publicly-owned parcels in the City of Boston, the RFPs will include a Diversity and Inclusion evaluation criterion, requiring proponents to include a Diversity and Inclusion Plan to outline their commitments to including M/WBEs in all aspects of their development which will be weighted at 25 percent of the total evaluation of the parcel. Respondents must also demonstrate how their proposals will allow the current residents of Upham's Corner to both remain in their communities and find additional pathways to economic opportunity.

Boston Planning & Development Agency and Boston Society for Architecture Launch Mass Timber Accelerator to Support Boston's Climate Action and Carbon Neutral Goals

The Boston Planning & Development Agency and Boston Society for Architecture this week launched the Mass Timber Accelerator for local building industry professionals to broaden awareness, identify new opportunities, and accelerate the use of mass timber in Boston and the New England region. The Accelerator will provide technical support and award up to ten \$25,000 grants for active development projects in the early phases of project planning.

The program supports the City of Boston's Climate Action Plan Update, an initiative created to meet Boston's Carbon Neutral 2050 goals. The expansion of mass timber construction practices is a critical step to reaching zero net carbon building and zoning standards.



The COVID Eviction Legal Help Project team at the Mass Law Reform Institute has just released MADE: Up To Code. This new website helps tenants document bad conditions in their home and take action to get the repairs they need.

Bad housing conditions are prevalent in communities across the state, an issue that has only been exacerbated by the pandemic. La Colaborativa, a community organization in Chelsea, partnered with us to develop a user-friendly tool that allows tenants to take concrete steps to assert their rights.



What can I do if I am worried about bad conditions in my apartment?

<u>Up To Code</u> allows you to track the problems you have in each room of your house, upload documentation, and then choose your next step. You can download pre-filled documents, such as a letter requesting an inspection.

Tenants in Chelsea have already started using this tool and have shared positive feedback. As one tenant, Natalia, shared...

"UpToCode made it easy for me to inspect my apartment on my own and document the problems. Now that I know my rights as a tenant, I've been sharing what I learned with other people."

that works across early-life systems to prevent obesity, promote healthy routines and behaviors, and reduce health disparities among young children and their families. As rates of childhood obesity reach historically high levels, results from First 1,000 Days study – recently published in Pediatrics – provide a path forward for a scalable model of obesity prevention for families. The program is working to create sustainable systems-level changes to manage obesity and start life healthy.

Dr. Elsie Taveras, the lead researcher, will present the study's research findings, the factors that led to the study's successful outcomes; and what can be done to disseminate these practices more broadly. Dr. Taveras is the Chief Community Health Equity Officer at Mass General Brigham, Executive Director of the Kraft Center for Community Health Improvement, and Conrad Taff Professor at Harvard Medical School.

CREW was awarded a research grant where we will look at extreme weather and social connectedness. CREW will be working with Tufts Professors Justin Hollander from the Urban and Environmental Planning and Policy department, James Intriligator from the Mechanical Engineering department, and Josh Ellsworth from the Friedman School of Nutrition Science and Policy. We will also be working with several Tufts students on this project.

<u>In recent research</u>, the Conservation Law Foundation (CLF) mapped out many of the social and physical risk factors that make communities more susceptible to extreme weather events and climate impacts. One risk factor not included directly in their analysis, however, was social connectedness.


Over the past decade, numerous studies have demonstrated that social connectedness, the bonds between and among neighbors and other community members, can have a powerful impact on a range of health and life outcomes. In a collaborative research project, CREW and inter-disciplinary Tufts faculty members will use a range of approaches to quantify the social connectedness of neighborhoods, including Downtown Boston/Chinatown and Roxbury, in several of the high-risk zones identified in the CLF report.

We will also research and develop possible interventions to improve social connectedness in these areas. Social connectedness is a significant and salient characteristic of climate-resilient communities, and our research will help build this important attribute in Boston's most climate-vulnerable neighborhoods. We plan to have this project finished and a report of the findings by the end of Spring 2022.


Accelerate Your Business to the Top

- Then we'll open up the breakout rooms for networking!


