

Mayor Wu Delivers Address to the Greater Boston Chamber of



Commerce

On September 13th, Mayor Michelle Wu addressed over 500 business leaders, residents, and stakeholders at the Government Affairs Forum hosted by the Greater Boston Chamber of Commerce.

In her <u>speech</u>, she highlighted the strong recovery our neighborhoods have experienced. East Boston, Roslindale, and Roxbury have experienced, on average, 16% higher spending than 2019. In Downtown Boston, August foot traffic reached pre-pandemic levels and S.P.A.C.E. grantees are locating in the area; more events are taking place, and tourism is the highest it's been since 2019.

Mayor Wu also shared how **companies like LEGO and many other companies are choosing to come to Boston** because of the diversity of our population, which makes us so special, and how this will provide major opportunities for career advancement and economic growth for our neighborhoods.

And finally, the Mayor makes **several key announcements related to zoning and development** across the city.





Specific Use Grants

- One may work for you!

Using grants as a primary source of funding is not a sustainable model unless you have a qualified staff dedicated to the process almost full time. However, opportunistic grants should be considered if the grant makes overall sense and fits your business' mission.



Need Money? Looking for a grant?

Here are some opportunities for financial assistance and grants that your business may be eligible for. These options are not part of or endorsed by SCORE but could be a source of funds for some of our clients:

- National Grid Small Business Impact Initiative (Deadline 10/31): The Black Economic Council of Massachusetts (BECMA), Amplify LatinX, the Mass. LGBT Chamber of Commerce and the Asian Business Empowerment Council are thrilled to collaborate with National Grid New England to offer a series of \$10,000 grants to businesses based in Massachusetts. These grants can be utilized for any project aimed at fostering business growth.
- <u>Hello Alice Growth Grant</u> (Deadline 10/27): In partnership with the Global Entrepreneurship Network (GEN) and with funding from Etsy and Progressive, the Small Business Growth Fund provides small business owners the capital they need to make their next move. Recipients will receive \$5,000-\$25,000 grants to help accelerate their growth and achieve their goals.
- <u>Amber Grant</u> (Applications due at the end of each month): Women's Net gives away at least \$30,000 every month in Amber Grant money. In recognition of the diversity of businesses owned by women, we've also expanded our grantgiving to include "Marketing Grants," "Business Category Grants," as well as two "\$25,000 Year End Grants."
- You Glow Girl Women Entrepreneur Grant: Entering its third year, the You Glow Girl grant is open to female entrepreneurs. Previous winners received \$10,000 grants and participated in a mentorship program. Applications open on October 19, 2023.
- <u>The Atomic Grant program</u> (deadline 12/15): This program offers \$1,500 microgrants to women business owners. Recipients also receive one-on-one strategy coaching sessions. Applications are accepted on a rolling basis, with grants awarded quarterly.
- <u>FedEx Entrepreneur Fund</u> (Deadline 10/6): Through the FedEx® Entrepreneur Fund, thirty (30) grants of \$10,000 each will be awarded to entrepreneurs who have a connection to the military and/or entrepreneurs with disabilities.



It was a Great day in Roxbury


We wanted to share some thoughts from Gregory Ball, our Director Of Production & Digital Strategy that were recently published on <u>BayStateBanner.com</u>. You can see the original piece by <u>clicking here</u>.

Sometimes, all it takes is someone without any quit in them to get things done. Ruth Batson was one of those people. Batson, a former Boston School Committee candidate and mother of three, was one of the key figures fighting for better education for the city's Black children. One of the pivotal moments of her fight saw its 60th anniversary late last month.

On September 22, 1963, an estimated 8,000 people took to the streets of Roxbury for the March for Better Schools. Sponsored by the Boston branch of the NAACP, the march ended at the Sherwin School on Windsor Street, a school that was constructed during the Civil War era. According to a report from the Harvard Crimson at the time, it was "the only building in the area which has yet to be condemned or razed. It is surrounded by a field of tall weeds, shells of partially demolished buildings, and a run-down playground." The rally on the school's steps spotlighted the building as a stark example of gross inequities.




