This is the second convening in a new research and conversation series on racial wealth equity in Greater Boston, jointly hosted by Boston Indicators and the Federal Reserve Bank of Boston. The event will feature research from the Boston Fed, Racial Wealth Disparities: Reconsidering the Roles of Human Capital and Inheritance. This paper builds upon common analyses of the Survey of Consumer Finances to generate a variety of new insights into the relative asset levels of different racial groups. The paper's more detailed wealth estimates reveal new findings about how earnings, pensions, and other education and work-related factors contribute to racial wealth disparities. Lead author, Jeffrey P. Thompson, will begin the event with an accessible presentation, and then we will transition to Q&A with the audience. Across our region, there's growing recognition that racial wealth inequity is among the most pressing issues we face. And fortunately, there's already a lot of great research to help inform organizing efforts for change. But there's a lot to digest and it can be intimidating for non-experts to find venues for learning about this work in an accessible way. That's where Boston Indicators and the Federal Reserve Bank of Boston's new Racial Wealth Equity Research and Conversation Series comes in. Each event will include one or two research presentations and then open for questions and discussion. Research presentations will dig into causes of and potential solutions to the racial wealth gap, including state and local levers that could narrow the gap. And we will always aim to do this in a non-technical way. We plan to host these events roughly four times per year. Watch for future events in the series!






Celebrate With Us and Our ALX100 Honorees!





Piecing together the Mass Central Rail Trail.
It is like putting Humpty Dumpty together again.

This is the longest and most complicated former RR corridor to reassemble in New England. Running from Northampton to Boston, it has been a 40+ year journey so far. It is the longest developing rail trail in New England. A report by DOT showed that that the MCRT can be completed, but it begs the question: What would a completed 100 mile long walking and biking trail mean to

the Commonwealth? We'll be joined by **Craig Della Penna**, who has given over 1,200 lectures in 21 states on various topics related to the conversion of former RRs into linear parks known as rail trails.

Creating Walkable Neighborhoods with Social Infrastructure



Since 2005, the federally funded Massachusetts Safe Routes to School (SRTS)

Program has been working to increase safe biking and walking for students by using a collaborative, community-focused approach that bridges the gap between health and transportation. Join this nationally #1 ranked program of MassDOT as we discuss their latest efforts, including the recent inclusion of high schools, driver education materials, and DESE-accreditation for professional development of their pedestrian and bike safety curriculum. Statewide Fatal Crashes in MA, July 2023

Each month, we post about the fatal crashes in Massachusetts from the previous month, and share any trends that we see. For the full list of monthly posts, head here.

Last month, we took a look at <u>crashes listed in the MassDOT Crash Portal in June;</u> three were identified as people walking. In our most recent post, we looked at crashes in MA in July 2023. The information in the chart below is compiled from news reports, and was checked against the <u>MassDOT Crash Portal Dashboard</u> "Fatal Crash Information." Any Google Street View images included below use the address listed in the crash portal.

- Of the 32 fatal crashes in Massachusetts in July in the MassDOT Crash portal, 3 were identified as people walking.
- The average age of pedestrians hit & killed in July was 60.

The <u>Shared Streets and Spaces Grant program</u> is back! The MassDOT program provides funding to municipalities and public transit authorities to quickly implement improvements to plazas, sidewalks, curbs, streets, bus stops, parking areas, and other public spaces in support of public health, safe mobility, and strengthened

The Fiscal Year 2024 grant round of the Shared Streets and Spaces Program will officially open on September 5th. Applications are due October 31, 2023. Only municipalities and public transit authorities are eligible to apply. Applications are submitted via an online form. For more details on how to apply, visit MassDOT's How to Apply Page.

SAFE ROUTES TO SCHOOL: Infrastructure Funding + Signs and Lines
Applications for Infrastructure Funding will be accepted from Wednesday, August
23, 2023 to Friday, October 6, 2023. Applications for Signs and Lines Projects will
be accepted from Wednesday, August 23, 2023 to Friday, September 22, 2023. The
SRTS Signs and Lines Program will provide design services and up to \$10,000 in
construction funding to a selected municipality for a low-cost infrastructure project
around a public elementary, middle, or high school. The goal of these projects is to
eliminate small barriers that students encounter when walking, bicycling, or using a
wheeled mobility device to get to school. Examples of a Signs and Lines Project

could include the purchase and installation of new signage or pavement markings.

This year's festival theme is 'The City That Sways Together, Stays Together' highlighting MOVEMENT in all its forms—recreational, social, and artistic.




